



Time allocation: 1 minute

Taking on this role improves observational and listening skills.

The ultimate goal of this role is to test whether members have been paying attention by asking a few short questions at the end of the meeting.

Throughout the meeting, you will listen and create 3-4 quiz questions to be asked to specific people of your choosing. Try to be humorous or a little obscure – and direct the questions particularly to people who have not played a significant role in the meeting.

You will have 2 minutes for your role – take 10-15 seconds to explain the ‘rules’ – ie. “I’ve put together a few questions to see how well everyone has been listening tonight. I’ll share my question and ask a specific person to answer – if they don’t know the answer, I’ll open the floor to everyone else”...

Keep your questions fairly simple yet challenging at the same time - it might be like “What was Andrew’s first job – and this question goes to Maria”... (question first, then who should answer).

You can find people’s names on the agenda that will be sent to you before the meeting.

When you are done, you can hand back to the Toastmaster “Thank you for playing, and back to you Chairman” or “This completes my assignment, back to you Chairman”...both are acceptable!

You’re more than welcome to bring ‘prizes’ like a chocolate or something for the person who gets the questions right.

Keep in mind you will be evaluated. Maintain a nice loud voice, keep your hands by your sides, use minimal notes and even stand in different places for each question so you can use the stage a bit.
